

Our design mandate for The Yard at Chicago Shakespeare was to create a wholly flexible theater that would act as a dynamic complement to our existing two venues—the Jentes Family Courtyard Theater and the Thoma Theater Upstairs. Since opening in late 2017, The Yard has transformed into eight distinct configurations with audience capacities ranging from 100 to nearly 800. In addition to supporting the development of our own work, this flexibility has also fostered the growth of our international offerings.

The National Theatre of Great Britain's award-winning thriller *An Inspector Calls*, helmed by legendary director Stephen Daldry, is a stunning—and sprawling—production. The sheer volume of the set and expansive staging require a large venue, and the production sits beautifully in The Yard. We are thrilled to have you join us for this masterpiece—a provocative exploration of social responsibility.

Chicago Shakespeare's commitment to showcase artistry from around the globe continues with our next WorldStage presentation: *Two Pints* from Ireland's Abbey Theatre. Penned by Booker Prize-winner Roddy Doyle, the play will be staged in Chicago Shakespeare's Pub—the first time in our history that this intimate space has been activated for performances. Meanwhile, playing in the Courtyard Theater is a 75-minute abridged production of *Macbeth* adapted specifically for student audiences. One of the most powerful plays in Shakespeare's canon, it will welcome 1,000 students and teachers daily during its run on Navy Pier, followed by a three-week tour to schools across the Chicago area.

About CST

Under the leadership of Artistic Director Barbara Gaines and Executive Director Criss Henderson, Chicago Shakespeare has redefined what a great American Shakespeare theater can be—a company that defies theatrical category. This Regional Tony Award-winning theater's year-round season features as many as twenty productions and 650 performances—including plays, musicals, world premieres, family programming, and presentations from around the globe. The work is enjoyed by 225,000 audience members annually, with one in four under the age of eighteen. Chicago Shakespeare is the city's leading presenter of international work, and in touring its own productions across five continents has garnered multiple accolades, including the prestigious Laurence Olivier Award. Emblematic of its role as a global theater, the company spearheaded Shakespeare 400 Chicago, celebrating Shakespeare's legacy in a citywide, yearlong international arts and culture festival, which engaged more than one million people. The Theater's nationally acclaimed arts in literacy programs support the work of English and drama teachers, and bring Shakespeare to life on stage for tens of thousands of their students each school year. Over the summer, the company tours a professional production of Shakespeare's work, free for all, to neighborhood parks across the city. In 2017 the Theater unveiled The Yard at Chicago Shakespeare—with its innovative design that has changed the shape of theater architecture. Together with the Jentes Family Courtyard Theater and the Thoma Theater Upstairs, The Yard positions Chicago Shakespeare as the city's most versatile performing arts center.



Ballantine, who at the time was also teaching princesses Elizabeth and Margaret Rose, Ms. Payne-Myers and her young dancing companions raised money for charity with performances at the Theatre Royal York, Theatre Royal Newcastle, the Scala in Soho, London, and Raby Castle. Shortly after the Second World War, she travelled to London, where she trained and danced with the Ballet Rambert. She also appeared in pantomimes, summer seasons. and variety as a sister act with horses and dogs, Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin and Jerry Lewis, tightrope walkers, and Max Miller. She appeared with Evelyn Laye and Anton Walbrook in Wedding in Paris at the London Hippodrome. A Girl Called Joe at the Piccadilly Theatre with Denis Quilley and Edward Woodward, For Adults Only—a satirical revue at the Aldwych Theatre, and is a founding member of Sadler's Wells Opera Ballet. Later, Ms. Payne-Myers toured to Europe, America, and Australia with Lloyd Newson's DV8 Physical Theatre Company.

She also worked with choreographers Matthew Hawkins, Arthur Pita, and Wayne McGregor. She appeared in Caryl Churchill's *The Skriker* and in Tennessee Williams' Baby Doll both at the Cottesloe. National Theatre; and Daniel Kramer's Wovzeck at the Gate and in New York. She has performed in Stephen Daldry's iconic production of An Inspector Calls on more occasions than any other actor, having first appeared as Edna at the Garrick Theatre in the 1990s, in subsequent UK tours, at the Aldwych, and in Australia. In the 2002 New Year Honours list, Ms. Payne-Myers was awarded an MBE for Services to Dance.

JB PRIESTLEY (Author) Mr. Priestley was born in 1894 in Bradford, Yorkshire, son of a schoolmaster. He left Belle Vue School at sixteen and worked in a wool office, when he began to write in his spare time. He volunteered for the army in 1914 and served in the First World War, surviving the grim conditions of the trenches. He received a grant to go to Cambridge and launched his professional career with Brief Diversions, a collection of short pieces that attracted attention in London. After graduating he moved to London with his first wife, Pat, and began his career as a professional writer, reviewing and writing essays and literary biographies, and reading for publisher John Lane. His fourth novel, The Good Companions, was published in 1929 and was a huge success, followed by Angel Pavement in 1930. He entered the theater in 1932 with Dangerous Corner and dominated the London stage during the 1930s with a succession of plays, such as Eden End. I Have Been Here Before. Time and the Conways. When We Are Married. Johnson Over Jordan, and into the 1940s with They Came to a City, An Inspector Calls, The Linden Tree, Summer Day's Dream, and The Glass Cage (1958). During the Second World War he established a new reputation as a broadcaster. A prolific writer, he continued writing novels, notably Bright Day and Lost Empires, as well as an important list of non-fiction. English Journey launched him in a new role as a social commentator: Midnight on the Desert and Rain upon Godshill were chapters of autobiography: Margin Released, a memoir: Literature and Western Man, the sum of a lifetime's reading; and three social histories: The Prince of Pleasure, The Edwardians, and Victoria's Hevday. Overall he published more than 100 books: nonfiction, fiction. and drama, as well as countless newspaper articles and reviews. He was married three times and had four daughters and one son. Mr. Priestley was a lifelong socialist of the old kind, vet never joined the Labour Party. He was a spokesman for the ordinary people, unashamedly middlebrow, patriotic, honest, and opposed to the class system. He turned down offers of a knighthood and a peerage, but gladly accepted the Order of Merit in 1977. He died in 1984.

CRISS HENDERSON

(Executive Director) is the executive director of Chicago Shakespeare and has produced the Theater's past twenty-nine seasons. Under his leadership,

CST has become one of the nation's leading regional theaters and one of Chicago's most celebrated cultural organizations, honored with the 2008 Tony Award for Outstanding Regional Theatre, as well as multiple Laurence Olivier and Joseph Jefferson Awards. He oversaw the Theater's move to its home on Navy Pier in 1999 and led the recent development of The Yard at Chicago Shakespeare. In 2016 he spearheaded the citywide, yearlong celebration of Shakespeare's legacy, Shakespeare 400 Chicago. Mr. Henderson has garnered multiple honors, including: the 2013 Cultural Innovation Award from the Chicago Innovation Awards; Arts Administrator of the Year by Arts Management Magazine at the Kennedy Center: recognition in Crain's Chicago Business "40 under 40"; and the Chevalier de L'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres by the Minister of Culture of France. Mr. Henderson has served on the boards of directors of the League of Chicago Theatres and Arts Alliance Illinois, and for many years as president of the Producers' Association of Chicago-area Theaters. Mr. Henderson is director of DePaul University's MFA/Arts Leadership Program, a two-year graduate-level curriculum in arts management training created through a joint partnership between Chicago Shakespeare Theater and The Theatre School


