

Welcome to the world premiere of Cadre by South African artist Omphile Molusi, Produced under the umbrella of our World's Stage Series, Chicago Shakespeare Theater is honored to partner with The Market Theatre of Johannesburg and UK's Richard Jordan Productions to bring this harrowing play to life. Examining the political and social complexities of apartheid is a daunting theatrical exercise. The process of developing this play has, in fact, spanned three years—from the first staged reading at CST in 2010 to subsequent workshops across continents. Now, finally, the world-premiere performance in Chicago is upon us and will be followed in short order by its premiere in South Africa.

It has been a powerful experience to bear witness to Omphile's process. His integration of a more "traditional" English narrative with South African songs and dialects serves to balance the delivery of historical context against the personal and culturally specific journey of the characters. Through the World's Stage Series at Chicago Shakespeare Theater, audiences are introduced to the varying perspectives of artists from across the globe. In the past decade, 600 artists representing sixteen countries on five continents have shared our stages. This season alone, Chicago audiences can experience work from Belarus, England, Italy, Scotland and South Africa. As a world-class theater reflective of our global city, we are proud to serve as the leading presenter of international theater in Chicago.

The months ahead hold more extraordinary productions, including Shakespeare's classics Julius Caesar and Henry VIII. Next up in our World's Stage Series is the American premiere of Roadkill by Cora Bissett, an Olivier Award-winning theatrical event that exposes the realities of human trafficking. We look forward to sharing these powerful stories with you.

Chicago Shakespeare Theater (CST) is a leading international theater company, known for vibrant productions that reflect Shakespeare's genius for intricate storytelling, musicality of language and depth of feeling for the human condition.

Recipient of the Regional Theatre Tony Award, Chicago Shakespeare's work has been recognized internationally with three of London's prestigious Laurence Olivier Awards, and by the Chicago theater community with seventy Joseph Jefferson Awards for Artistic Excellence. ST guest scholar Bea Bosco spoke with Omphile Molusi as he was developing his new play.

Bea Bosco: How did you first get involved with theater?

Omphile Molusi: I was born in a village called Bodibe in South Africa, where I was raised by my grandmother, and when I was eighteen went to live with my mother in the township of Itsoseng. I was first introduced to theater at university, where I got involved in a community theater group. I fell in love with it, and then went into drama at The Market Theatre Laboratory in Johannesburg. After graduating, I started writing plays. And then I was given the chance to go to the Royal Shakespeare Company to study acting Shakespeare with Cicely Berry and John Barton.

BB: When did you first start writing?

OM: I was a very quiet child. I couldn't express things, and so I had lots of books where I just wrote down my feelings. That's where my writing really began.

BB: Is there a type of story that you want to tell now?

OM: I write about personal stories mostly. *Cadre* is a story about my uncle. The Azanian People's Liberation Army was a guerilla movement set up during apartheid by a liberation movement called PAC, the Pan Africanist Congress, and my uncle used to be an APLA soldier. My uncle's story is a universal story about the past. And in the past, we can learn a lot about how to take care of the present.

BB: The story takes place during a very difficult time in the history of your country, but on a personal level, it's also a particularly harrowing story.

OM: In 1994 when the ANC came into power, other liberation parties were not happy about the deal the ANC made with the white government, the National Party. Before the election, a lot of parties involved in the struggle were involved in the negotiations. They didn't want a merger; they wanted black people to run the government. The other liberation movements felt like the ANC sold the people out. Mandela said, 'Drop your arms. Do not fight.' A lot of people at the time felt that the struggle for freedom was aborted. In *Cadre*, the relationship between Sasa and Gregory is a personal story I created to give access into that world. I use their story as a metaphor. Hence, the love story between the comrades, who had so much love and passion for this country, and who wanted their own kind of freedom.

BB: How have you come to understand the difficult choices that people had to make?

OM: Whatever people did during that time, they were fighting to be treated as humans. I want people to see this as a personal story about people who acted like this because they were standing up for what is not right in their lives.

BB: It's been almost twenty years since the end of apartheid. There's a new generation coming up that never experienced it. How does a story like this resonate for them?

OM: People don't really want to hear stories of the past. They just want to move on, to forget about it. And because the ANC government is still in power, it's like no one else was fighting in this struggle. When I decided to tell this story, I wondered whether a modern audience would connect to a story about the PAC. That is another reason the play is not just a political story. It is a human story. Then we start getting the bigger picture—understanding that we cannot hide the past. I wish people could walk out of this play saying, "We have a past, and that past, as hard as it has been, teaches us to take care of the present. So that we do not go back there. So that we can have a better future."

Playgoer's Guide

AFRIKANER Descendants of the Boers are commonly referred to as Afrikaners. More broadly, the term is used for all Afrikaans speakers, regardless of ethnic origins. Afrikaners comprise approximately sixty percent of the white population of South Africa.

ANC, THE AFRICAN NATIONAL CONGRESS Founded in 1912, the ANC fought to organize black Africans in the struggle for civil rights, in order to bring an end to white domination and create a multiracial South Africa. After his twenty-seven year imprisonment, African resistance leader Nelson Mandela was elected President in the first multiracial elections. The ANC remains the ruling party of post-apartheid South Africa.

APARTHEID From 1948 to 1994, apartheid was the official policy implemented by South Africa's National Party government to maintain separate government-demaarcated racial groups. It was abolished by the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa of 1993. Literally meaning "separateness," the word comes from Afrikaans, a language spoken in South Africa.

APLA, AZANIAN PEOPLE'S LIBERATION ARMY The military wing of the Pan Africanist Congress (PAC), originally called Poqo, was modeled on the Chinese People's Liberation Army.

BOER From the Dutch word for "farmer," Boer refers to a South African of Dutch, German or Huguenot descent, especially the descendants of the early seventeenth-century settlers. Friction with the British, who took possession of the Cape Colony in 1806 as a result of the Napoleonic wars, culminated in the Boers surrendering in 1902 following two years of war. However, they retained their language and culture, including their policy of racial segregation.

BOTHA Pieter Willem "P. W." Botha, nicknamed "Die Groot Krokodil" or "The Big Crocodile," was the head of state of South Africa, 1978-1989. His Nationalist Party initiated the system of racial segregation that came to be called apartheid when it came to power in 1948. Under Botha's leadership, the political crisis deepened and racial violence increased. Refusing to testify before South Africa's Truth and Reconciliation Commission, which was formed to probe apartheid-era crimes, he remained unapologetic throughout his lifetime.

PAC, THE PAN AFRICANIST CONGRESS OF AZANIA Splintering from the ANC in 1959 over strategic differences, the PAC opposed including whites and Indians in the anti-apartheid struggle. In 1960 they organized campaigns against the Pass Laws, including one demonstration where thousands of unarmed people gathered without their passes and were met with police brutality; sixty-nine protesters were killed in Sharpeville-most were shot in the back. The government responded to the massacre by banning the ANC and the PAC, forcing the movement underground and serving as a catalyst for a change in strategy from passive to armed resistance.

THE PASS LAWS ACT The Natives (Abolition of Passes and Co-ordination of Documents) Act, 1952, commonly known as the Pass Laws Act, required all Africans to carry identification similar to an internal passport, including name, address, photo, fingerprints, and the name of their employer. Between 1948 and 1973, over ten million were arrested because their passes were "not in order."

THE SOBUKWE CLAUSE The conviction of Robert Managliso Sobukwe for incitement, who was viewed by the South African Administration as a radical and difficult opponent, gave rise to the Amendment Act, later to become known as the Sobukwe Clause since he was the only prisoner to whom the Act was ever applied. The Amendment Act allowed his imprisonment to be renewed annually at the discretion of the Minister of Justice.

1652

Dutch East India Company establishes permanent settlement as base camp for spice trade sailors. Expansion to farming creates labor shortage; slaves imported from West Africa, Madagascar, Malaysia, India.

1800s

1806: British conquer the Cape colony of 20,000 white colonists, 25,000 slaves, 15,000 native black Africans, and 1,000 freed black slaves. British critical of white elite's racist practices.

1838: Slavery abolished. Some Boers leave Cape for two white-ruled republics.

1860–1900: Discovery of diamonds and gold fuels new economy. British subjugate neighboring areas for needed labor. Africans housed in fenced barracks under surveillance.

1899–1902: South African War (so-called "Boer War") ends in British defeating Boers and annexing South African Republic and the Orange Free State.

1900s

1910: Union of South Africa, created from Cape and Natal colonies, the Orange Free State and South African Republic.

1912: African National Congress (ANC) founded.

1913: Native Lands Act gives Africans, comprising 80% of population, 7.3% of country's land.

1948: National Party elected and institutionalizes segregationist policies under name "apartheid." Three racial groups identified: white, colored (mixed race or Asian), and native. Group Areas Act creates separate communities, with non-whites relocated into "reserves." Bantu Homelands Acts designates lands reserved for black Africans as independent nations, stripping millions of their South African citizenship. Blacks required to carry passes to enter white South Africa.

1959: Pan Africanist Congress (PAC) founded by Robert Mangaliso Sobukwe in support of African nationalism, socialism and continental unity.

1960s: ANC's new military wing, headed by Mandela, launches sabotage campaigns.

1960: Led by Robert Mangaliso Sobukwe, PAC organizes Anti-Pass Laws campaign throughout country. Immediately after Sharpeville massacre, where 69 protesters were killed by police, the Nationalist Party Government bans both ANC and PAC.

1964: Mandela sentenced to life imprisonment.

1969: Robert Mangaliso Sobukwe released from prison and allowed to live with his family.

1976: Soweto Uprising, triggered by regulation that students be taught in Afrikaans. Police respond to massive student protests with qunfire; approximately 600 people killed.

1978: Robert Mangaliso Sobukwe dies while under house arrest.

1980s: International boycotts of South African products and pressures to end apartheid, coupled with civil disobedience and escalating violence; government repeals some of the laws.

1990: Ban against ANC and PAC lifted; Mandela freed after twenty-seven years in prison.

1994: First multiracial democratic elections bring ANC to power; Nelson Mandela elected president. ■

OMPHILE MOLUSI

(Actor/Director/Playwright) has been a freelance writer/actor/director since 2001. Acting credits include: Shakespeare Dreaming at the Zoo. Sizwe Bansi Is Dead. Animal Farm, Robben Island Bible. Itsosena. Romeo and Iuliet. The Mirror, Caucasian Chalk Circle, Much Ado About Nothing, Echoes, Blurring Shine, Julius Caesar, Sharpeville 1 and 2, among others. Playwriting credits include: Itsoseng, which he performed internationally, including at Chicago Shakespeare Theater, Edinburgh Festival Fringe and Dublin Festival in Ireland (published by Junkets Publishers and Oxford University Press South Africa, adapted for BBC radioplay); Informal (The Market Theatre Laboratory, National School of the Arts); Cadre (reading at Chicago Shakespeare Theater); Balalatladi (reading at The Kennedy

Center, Family Season Festival in Cape Town); For the Right Reasons (published by Oxford University Press South Africa, Junkets Publishers); Daddy Comes Tonight (published by Junkets Publishers); The Sweet Door (Windybrow Theatre); Ijo! (The Market Theatre Laboratory, Grahamstown National Arts Festival 2005); Pozeng (resident project, The Market Theatre Laboratory); and a short story Bargain (published by Penguin Publishers). Directing credits include: Informal, Balalatladi, Ijo and Pozeng. Television writing credits include: Zone 14 series 2, 3, 4 and 5. Mr. Molusi was the first recipient of the Bret Goldin Bursary, which gave him the opportunity to intern at the Royal Shakespeare Company as an actor. He also won the Scotsman Fringe First Award 2008 for Itsoseng (Edinburgh Festival Fringe), the Andre Deshields Award for Itsoseng, and in Chicago, the Black Theatre Alliance Award for Best Performance in 2010. He taught the Cicely Berry voice technique and acting at the Actors Centre and is

currently teaching at The Market Theatre Laboratory. Mr. Molusi is a graduate of The Market Theatre Laboratory, where since 2010 he has served as a field worker.
